### **EXPERT ANALYSIS**

## 1. Expert analysis of banknotes and coins

In 2023, expert analysis of suspect counterfeits detected 1,985 counterfeit dinar banknotes.


Table 1 shows the denomination structure of detected dinar counterfeits.



In the structure of detected counterfeits, the dominant share is of that of counterfeit 2000dinar banknotes (60.55%), followed by 1000-dinar (15.67%) and 500-dinar banknotes (11.74%) (Chart 1).



Percentage-wise, those three denominations together make up 87.96% of the total number of counterfeits detected in the observed year.

Looking at the past ten years, those three denominations have prevailed among detected dinar counterfeits (Chart 2).




In value terms, 2000-dinar (75.87%) and 5000-dinar banknotes (9.94%) made up the largest share of the dinar counterfeit structure (Table 2 and Chart 3).

In percentage terms, those two denominations made up 85.81% of dinar counterfeits.

A comparison of the number of detected banknote counterfeits with that of genuine dinar banknotes in circulation reveals that 3.40 in every 1 million circulating banknotes were found to be counterfeit, i.e. there was RSD 6953.43 worth of counterfeits in every RSD 1 billion.

#### 2. Expert analysis of foreign currency banknotes

In the period January–December 2023, expert analysis of suspect counterfeit banknotes detected 1,026 foreign currency counterfeits. Their currency and denomination structure is presented in Table 3.




In the period observed, 611 counterfeit euro banknotes were detected, mostly in 200- and 50-euro denominations. Chart 4 illustrates the trends observed over the last ten years in terms of the number of detected counterfeit 50-,100- and 200-euro banknotes.

Chart 4 The most frequent euro counterfeits (pieces)




In 2023, 310 counterfeit 100-dollar banknotes were detected. Over the years, it has been noticed that 100-dollar banknotes accounted for the dominant share of counterfeit dollar banknotes.

Chart 5 shows movements in the number of detected 100-dollar counterfeits over the last ten years.



In the observed period, the item "Other" in Table 3 refers to the following counterfeits: two 20-pound sterling notes, one 100-Swiss franc and one 100-convertible mark notes.

In nominal value terms, the share of individual currencies in total foreign cash counterfeits is best illustrated if expressed in euros<sup>1</sup> (Chart 6).





#### 3. Ratio of counterfeit dinar to foreign currency banknotes

Among the total of 3,011 counterfeit banknotes detected in 2023, dinar counterfeits were the dominant category and their share, as well as the share of the number of foreign currency counterfeits in the total number of counterfeits, is given in Chart 7.



As shown, in terms of the number of pieces, the share of detected counterfeit dinar banknotes is the highest -1,985 pieces (65.92%), followed by the euro -611 pieces (20.29%), US dollar -411 pieces (13.65%), and four pieces of other currencies (0.13%).



In nominal value terms, the share of individual currencies in total counterfeits in 2023 is best illustrated if expressed in dinars<sup>2</sup> (Chart 8).

Of the total amount of RSD 20,010,283.97 (dinar equivalent of the total value of all currencies' counterfeits), the share of counterfeit euro banknotes is the highest - RSD 12,952,421.71 (64.73%), followed by the US dollar - RSD 3,865,216.11 (19.32%), the domestic currency - RSD 3,168,630.00 (15.84%) and other currencies - RSD 24,016.14 (0.12%).

<u>Note</u>: In 2023, NBS also carried out an expert analysis of 200 pieces 50-cent, 1-euro and 2-euro coins and detected 24 counterfeit pieces: twenty-three 2-euro coins and one 1-euro coin.
